










COLLABORATION

IMPORTANT IMPACTS ON NON-EU COUNTRIES

Three important trends affecting non-EU supplies to the EU market

New demands for information

Growing pressure for more information about the supply chain and greater attention to impact of EU businesses on non-EU countries (e.g. Corporate Sustainability Due Diligence)

EU rules indirectly affecting non-EU countries

Stricter rules governing EU agrifood production and supply. Many of these also affect imported goods (e.g. use of plant protection products)

Direct rules on production/supply

EU must avoid environmental/social harm by causing or shifting bad practice to non-EU countries (or making EU production less competitive) (e.g. sustainable packaging, animal welfare)

EU DEFORESTATION REGULATION AS AN EXAMPLE

Products may only be sold on EU market if:

- 1. "deforestation-free"
- 2. "legal"

Suppliers must provide data & information to demonstrate this

No deforestation after 31 December 2020

<u>Information required from producers:</u>

- Geolocation of the plot of land where the products were grown using digital applications e.g. Geographic Information Systems (GIS)
- 2. Date/time range of production

Products must be produced in line with the relevant laws of the country of production

e.g. land-use rights, environmental protection, forestrelated regulations, labour rights.

Geolocation and information on legality must be passed on through the chain

SOME CHALLENGES RESULTING FROM GD AND F2F

- Keeping track of the multiple and overlapping changes in EU rules
- Understanding what (due diligence) information is required by buyers to evidence compliance
- Tools, technologies and systems needed to collect and record this information
- Traceability systems to pass information throughout supply chains
- Costs of adapting and evidencing practices (3rd party certification?)
- Meeting EU rules designed for the EU context (but that may be more challenging and costly for 3rd countries)
- Cumulation of different initiatives

WHEN IT GOES WRONG



Case study: vanilla in Madagascar

Keeping on top of rule changes is crucial!

July 2022

February 2023

End 2023/2024?

EU notifies WTO of nicotine MRL reduction for vanilla from 0.3 to 0.02 mg/kg

Regulation published: new MRL applies from September 2023




Significant % of Madagascan vanilla > 0.05;
fears of exclusion from EU market

Madagascar vanilla exports to EU

= €250 million or 50% of their exports to the EU

= 8% of their global goods exports

= 2% of GDP

KEEPING UP WITH THE RULES


What's needed to keep trade flowing and ensure that no one is left behind
